The Legislative Advocacy Cycle

Interim



- The time between legislative sessions.
- Legislators are deciding their policy priorities.
- The most important advocacy occurs.
- Time to reflect and plan for next steps.
- Opportunity to build relationships and to engage your students, community, and legislators.

Session




- Starts the 2nd Monday of every year.
- Lasts 60 days in even years and 105 in odd years
- Odd years are when biennial budget is established and big policy issues are addressed (marathon)
- Even years are "supplemental" when policies and budgets are tweaked (sprint)
- Communications to legislators are concise and targeted.



Year-Round Advocacy Cycle

January-March/April (Session)

- Stay informed with WSSDA's InSession tools.
- Share information with your legislators and their staff.
- Respond to Legislative Committee questions.
- Ask Leg Rep to report out at each board meeting.
- Review the WSSDA advocacy platform.



March/April-June (Post-Session)

- Thank your legislators and invite them to visit.
- Identify your board priorities for the next session.
- Review WSSDA's position platform.
- Consider the WSSDA platform revision process
- Attend monthly Leg Rep Network (LRN) meetings (first Tuesdays at noon)

July - August

- Continue communicating and meeting with legislators.
- Review the General Assembly handbook.
- Determine pro or con for proposals (as a board).
- Identify your voting delegate(s).
- Attend LRN Meetings.



September - October

- Participate and vote in General Assembly.
- Participate in position prioritization process.
- Share your district and WSSDA legislative priorities.
- Share data and stories with legislators.
- Attend LRN Meetings




November - December

- Attend advocacy learning sessions at WSSDA's Annual Conference.
- Introduce yourself to new legislators.
- Schedule a time to connect with them before session begins.
- Continue to share data and stories.

Engage with Legislators



- Seek them out
- Send thank you notes
- Invite them to your schools
- Attend their Town Halls
- Meet with them in person
 - Informal, ask questions, no agenda



Tips for Setting Up a Meeting



- Email or call your legislator or their Legislative Assistant to schedule a meeting.
 - Identify the subject and timeframe.
 - Be flexible and patient.
- Arrange for another board member or superintendent to join you.
- Let the legislator or their staff know who will be in attendance.
- Call or email WSSDA Advocacy Team to let them know you have a meeting.

2025 Legislative Session



- Starts January 13, 2025 (in 299 days)
- 105 days ("long session")
- Major policy and budget considerations
- New legislators in House and Senate
- Significant leadership and committee changes

Leading as the Leg Rep



Length of service

Each school board can designate the length of time for a member to serve as a legislative representative (leg rep). It is suggested that a member serve no less than two years in order to grow within the role.

Time commitment

The amount of time needed to effectively serve as a legislative representative is variable depending on the expectations of the board and the interest of the representative. Based on discussions with current legislative representatives, the estimated time commitment is up to 20 hours/month.

Responsibilities

As outlined in WSSDA's Operating Policy 2051, the suggested responsibilities of a legislative representative are to:

- Review WSSDA position proposals with their board prior to the annual General Assembly.

 (It may be appropriate to schedule a special meeting for reviewing proposals to allow sufficient time for discussion of the issue.)
- Provide legislative updates periodically at their board meetings. Some boards establish a standing legislative representative update on their board meeting agendas.
- Share information from WSSDA publications and communications.
- Coordinate their board's efforts to propose new WSSDA positions or amendments to existing positions.
 This discussion can happen as October the preceding year.
- Represent their board at state level meetings (e.g., the General Assembly, the Olympia Legislative Conference, and any area or regional workshops).
- · Contact and communicate with legislators when legislative issues require it.

State Level

legislators

- Monitor legislative developments at both the state and federal levels.
- Engage in year-round advocacy efforts.

Board Level

- Prioritize legislative positions

- Represent your board at General Assembly
- Propose new positions or amendments

Federal Level

- Get involved in the legislative session
 Get involved with the Federal Relations Network
- Write and deliver testimony
 Build relationships with
 congressional delegation
 - Write and send emails






